This is a last dollar scholarship that is awarded to a student whose official Expected Family Contribution (EFC), located on your Student Aid Report, and financial aid packages totals are less than the cost of tuition and fees.

- Endorsed by a partnering community organization from One Family's network **OR** referred by two organizations with which the applicant is currently affiliated
- A single head of household with dependent children under the age of 18
- Family income at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level
- An entering or returning student at an approved accredited undergraduate institution in Massachusetts
- A permanent resident of Massachusetts and a United States citizen or Resident Alien
- Have a definite plan to use the desired degree to enter a family-
